Udall Undergraduate Scholarship

• Purpose

• The purpose of the Udall Undergraduate Scholarship is to pay tribute to Morris and Stewart Udall, whose work had a significant impact on the preservation of American Indian culture. The scholarship is worth up to \$5,000 towards the educational expenses of students working towards further preservation of the American Indian people, land, or culture.

• Eligibility Requirements

- Students must be sophomore or junior-level college student at a two-year or fouryear accredited institution of higher education in the United States
- Students must be pursuing a bachelor's or associate's degree full time during the 2018-2019 academic year; and
- Students must be a U.S. citizen, U.S. national, or U.S. permanent resident.

Application Process

- To apply for the Udall Undergraduate Scholarship students must first contact the campus representative, Randy Gilland, to start the application process.
- Students can expect the following requirements on the application:
 - An 11-question application
 - An 800-word essay on a speech, legislative act, book, or public policy statement by either Morris K. Udall or Stewart L. Udall and its impact on your interests and goals
 - Transcripts for all college coursework
 - Three letters of recommendation that speak to your leadership, public service and academic achievements.
- The application deadline is typically early March each cycle.

• Selection Process

• Applications are reviewed and award letters will be mailed to students in early April.
